How we started

Raoul Follereau was a French journalist, who dedicated his life for the cause of **people living with leprosy.**

Amici di Raoul Follereau affectionately called AIFO was founded in India in 1998 by Dr V Ekambaram to apply Follereau's approach of sharing love and serving people with leprosy within their families and communities.

While the early vision was to **eradicate leprosy** through **early identification** and **treatment**, the programme soon expanded to include **surveys**, **education** and **community** acceptance.

Progressing Towards

Plans for 2019-2020

- o Train 400 healthcare providers in the North Eastern States
- o Conduct 50 corrective surgeries for leprosy deformity in Assam
- o Strengthen "Association of Persons Affected by Leprosy North East" for advocacy of rights and social inclusion

And ahead.

- 1. Work with government in order to strengthen the government health system to detect and treat 12,000 people affected by Leprosy in North East and Karnataka.
- 2. Provide ulcer care, eye surgery, assistive devices and preventive care for 3,000 Persons affected by leprosy to prevent disability.
- 3. Provide 100 reconstructive surgeries for persons with disabilities through leprosy.
- 4. Strengthening of 900 self-help groups with 5,000 people with disabilities to be self-sustained through partnerships.
- 5. Provide therapeutic services to promote the mobility and functional independence 20,000 people with disabilities through partners.
- 6. To enable 200 self-help groups to link with banks for micro credit schemes.
- 7. Assist 500 women to establish income generation activities and micro enterprises.
